Our story

Jesuit education has been a vibrant presence in Australasia contributing to Catholic Education and wider society for more than 160 years.

The Jesuit and Companion Colleges continue to bring life to Ignatian Spirituality and nurture Jesuit education. The whole philosophy of Jesuit education is contained in the opening sentence of the Spiritual Exercises (First Principle and Foundation), that we are created to praise, reverence and serve God our Lord. Our aim is to enliven these concepts in our context of Jesuit education.

Mission Statement

The Mission of JEA is to nurture Jesuit and Companion College education ministries as Catholic institutions within the tradition of St Ignatius, where the ethos and identity of each College reflects the spirituality of Ignatius's Spiritual Exercises and the Jesuit and Ignatian tradition and is in conformity with the doctrine, rites, and practices of the Catholic church.

Statement of Intent

In providing strategic direction, JEA will:

- Listen to those it accompanies and to the signs of the times
- Foster the growth of leadership informed by Ignatian Spirituality
- Encourage opportunities where contemporary ethical issues and tensions may be wrestled with
- Focus on justice and equity and explore ways to further the apostolic purpose of Jesuit education
- Support and create occasions to strengthen and grow relationships, and
- Provide constant assistance to enable fidelity to Mission.

So that:

- We further the mission of Jesuit Education in Australasia
- Ensure adherence to Province policies, and
- Give effect to governing documentation.

The five priorities identified in the Strategic Plan 2020–2022 are still considered by JEA to be most relevant.

These, together with the Universal Apostolic Preferences, the Province Priorities, and the Global Identifiers become the tributaries by which JEA will accompany the Jesuit, and Companion Colleges.

- Continuing to promote a Safeguarding culture.

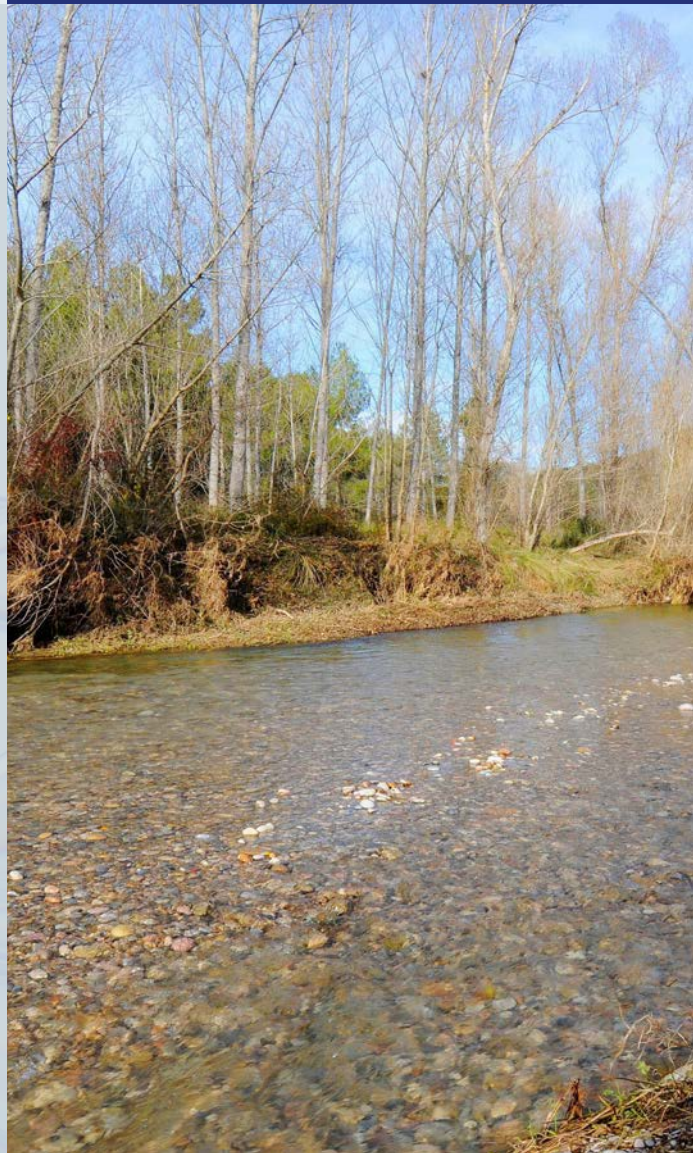
